Should ASSOCIATE CLINICIANS perform external cephalic version (ECV)?

Problem: Poor access to ECV

Option: Associated clinicians performing ECV

Comparison: Care delivered by other cadres or no care

Setting: Community/primary health care settings in LMICs with poor access to health professionals
