

9.1. RECOMMENDATION:

Should AUXILIARY NURSES deliver neonatal resuscitation?

Problem: Poor access to neonatal care

Option: Auxiliary nurses delivering neonatal resuscitation
Comparison: Care delivered by other cadres or no care
Setting: Community/primary health care settings in LMICs with poor access to

health professionals

Recommendation	We recommend against the option	We suggest considering the option only in the context of rigorous research	We recommend the option
	We suggest considering this option only in the context of rigorous research. We suggest evaluating this intervention where auxiliary nurses are already an established cadre and where a well-functioning referral system is in place or can be put in place.		
Justification	There is insufficient evidence on the effectiveness of auxiliary nurses delivering neonatal resuscitation. However, this intervention is probably acceptable, is probably feasible and may reduce inequalities by extending care to underserved populations.
