

## 12.3. RECOMMENDATION:

## Should AUXILIARY NURSES insert and remove intrauterine device (IUDs)?

**Problem**: Poor access to contraception

Option: Auxiliary nurses inserting and removing IUDs
Comparison: Care delivered by other cadres or no care
Setting: Community/primary health care settings in LMICs with poor access to

health professionals

Recommendation	We recommend against the option	We suggest considering the option only in the context of rigorous research	We recommend the option
	We suggest considering using use auxiliary nurses to insert and remove IUDs only in the context of rigorous research.		
Justification	There is insufficient evidence on the effectiveness of this intervention. In addition, auxiliary nurses do not have pelvic assessment competency within their scope and would require some training. However, this intervention may be a cost-effective, feasible and acceptable approach and may reduce inequalities by extending care to underserved populations.
