

12.5. RECOMMENDATION:

Should AUXILIARY NURSES perform tubal ligation (post-partum and interval)?

Problem: Poor access to contraception
Option: Auxiliary nurses performing tubal ligation
Comparison: Care delivered by other cadres or no care
Setting: Community/primary health care settings in LMICs with poor access to health professionals
