

12.6. RECOMMENDATION:

Should AUXILIARY NURSE MIDWIVES perform vasectomy?

Problem: Poor access to contraception **Option**: Auxiliary nurse midwives performing vasectomy **Comparison**: Care delivered by other cadres or no care **Setting**: Community/primary health care settings in LMICs with poor access to

health professionals

Recommendation	We recommend against the option	We suggest considering the option only in the context of rigorous research	We recommend the option
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	We suggest considering this option only in the context of rigorous research. Implementation in the context of research should be done where: - auxiliary nurse midwives are already an established cadre - a well-functioning referral system is in place or can be put in place Note: Five members of the panel dissented and indicated that they would prefer to recommend against the option as they considered this procedure to exceed the typical scope of practice of auxiliary nurse midwives.		
Justification	There is insufficient evidence on the effectiveness of this intervention. In addition, there is uncertainty regarding its acceptability, feasibility and cost-effectiveness.
